

ACADEMIC SUPPORT The Academic Support Program meets the needs and provides academic success for SMCC students with various learning styles, including students with mild to moderate learning disabilities, attention deficit disorder, autism spectrum disorder, generalized anxiety disorders, emotional and health impairments, and other types of academic needs.

INCLUSION PROGRAM The St. Andre Bessette Open Doors Inclusion Program offers the SMCC experience to students of all abilities, including those with significant cognitive and learning challenges. The first program of its kind at any Catholic high school in the state of Michigan!

COLLEGE COUNSELING



At SMCC, students begin preparing for college and careers as soon as they walk through the door. The College Counselors advise each student and their family throughout their four years to take the curriculum that will provide them the base for their college and career plans. All SMCC students and parents have access to Naviance, which is the primary tool that we use to assist with the career and college selection process. Our goal is for each student to find the college and/or career path that is the right fit along with opportunities for financial assistance to make it more affordable.


